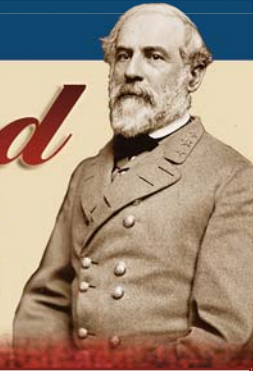

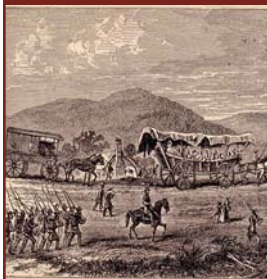

Part of a modernization trend in military medicine, the tents featured a unique radiant floor heating system.

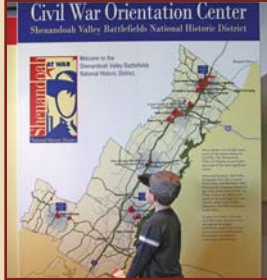
